A new Encyclical Letter from Pope Francis



On Thursday, Pope Francis published his fourth

Encyclical Letter, "Dilexit nos" (Latin for "He loved us"). It focuses on the theme of human and divine love as embodied in the Sacred Heart of Jesus. Released amidst a world troubled by war, socio-economic inequalities, unchecked consumerism, and technologies that threaten to undermine human nature, the Encyclical calls for a renewed focus on Christ's heart as a symbol of compassion and spiritual healing.

"'He loved us', Saint Paul says of Christ (cf. Rom 8:37), in order to make us realize that nothing can ever "separate us" from that love (Rom 8:39)". The Encyclical is dedicated to the human and divine love of the Heart of

Jesus Christ: "His open heart has gone before us and waits for us, unconditionally, asking only to offer us His

love and friendship," the Pope writes in the introductory paragraph. "For 'He loved us first' (cf. 1 Jn 4:10). Because of Jesus, 'we have come to know and believe in the love that God has for us' (1 Jn 4:16)." The release of *Dilexit nos* coincides with the 350th anniversary of the Apparition of the Sacred Heart to Saint Margaret Mary Alacoque between 1673-1675. Our Lord revealed to the French nun his heart, surrounded by flames and encircled by thorns, symbolizing his love for humanity despite the wounds inflicted by sin. The apparitions took place at the convent of Paray-le-Monial in Burgundy, France.

The Pope concludes his Encyclical with this prayer:

"I ask our Lord Jesus Christ to grant that His Sacred Heart may continue to pour forth the streams of living water that can heal the hurt we have caused, strengthen our ability to love and serve others, and inspire us to journey together towards a just, solidary and fraternal world. Until that day when we will rejoice in celebrating together the banquet of the heavenly kingdom in the presence of the risen Lord, who harmonizes all our differences in the light that radiates perpetually from his open heart. May he be blessed forever"

The Eternal Life for which we hope: 'We are already children of God... [In the future] we shall be like him because we shall see him as he really is' During November especially, Catholics particularly pray about the future we hope to enjoy after death the fulness of that divine life we have already started to share with God here and now. So, **we honour the Saints and pray for the Holy Souls**.

The words in the title above come from Saint John's First Letter, and we shall hear them on Friday at the Mass for All Saints' Day: 'My dear people, we are already the children of God but what we are to be in the future has not yet been revealed; all we know is, that when it is revealed we shall be like him because we shall see him as he really is. Surely everyone who entertains this hope must purify himself, must try to be as pure as Christ.' At the end of September, we paid special honour to our parish patron, Saint Vincent de Paul. On Friday this week, we begin the new month of November by giving God thanks for the holiness of so many disciples of Christ whom the Church has recognised as 'Saints'. As in other months, during the days of November that follow, there are also particular celebrations of others whose memory will inspire us, especially if we read their lives or reflect on their words: among them are Saints Martin de Porres, Martin of Tours, Margaret of Scotland, Elizabeth of Hungary, the Vietnamese Martyrs and, at the end of the month, one of Jesus' first followers, Saint Andrew. Moreover, in November we especially remember and pray for all we have known and loved who have gone before us – the 'Holy Souls' – entrusting them to God's great mercy.

So, Friday is the Solemnity of All Saints – a <u>Holy Day of Obligation</u> for Catholics: a major Feast when, as on Sunday, we are obliged to ensure that celebrating Mass will be at the centre of our day.

Holiness is the purpose of this earthly life for anyone who follows Jesus Christ. The call to holiness (to become like Christ) is what draws us together regularly for prayer and worship in our parish, and to all the sacraments we celebrate, especially the Holy Mass. Holiness will come as we respond to Jesus' invitation to all: 'Come, follow me'. Holiness is what Friday's great Feast Day celebrates. It is of such fundamental importance that the Church wants to ensure we celebrate this, hence it is a Holyday of Obligation. **We have Masses, in the morning and evening, to make it easier for you to do so.**

Holiness comes in many forms. On many days, saints are honoured – usually on the date of their death, which was when they were 'born into heavenly life'. On Friday, we honour them all collectively: the familiar along with others we may not yet have heard of; people from every age and background; those chosen directly by Jesus, like Peter, Andrew, and Paul; others from more recent times, like John Henry Newman, Thérèse of Lisieux, Charles de Foucauld, Titus Brandsma, Maximillian Kolbe, Blessed Carlo Acutis; men, women, and children; young and old, wives and husbands, single people; people from lowly as well as more distinguished backgrounds; clergy too. In **this 'feast of sanctity'**, we honour the remarkable ways in which, by God's grace, the holiness of Christ has been manifested down through the centuries in human lives like ours.

Try to discover saints whose lives may inspire you, and the part they can play in your Christian life. They might inspire you to take Christ's words as seriously as they did – in their lives, you may find echoes of your own, and so see what opportunities we have to follow Jesus. Their joys and struggles may give us courage in accepting ours. The ways they lived their lives may enlighten us. Prayers some wrote show us how we might pray. In some cases, their writings can touch us deeply.

And we also believe they are our intercessors, that is that they pray that we make progress on our own journeys of faith. If you are unsure about invoking their intercession, just recall the end of the 'Hail Mary', prayed for centuries, in which we ask Our Lady: 'Holy Mary, mother of God, pray for us sinners, now and at the hour of our death'. We believe that those who grew close to the Lord in this world desire that we should do so too. Thérèse of Lisieux, foreseeing her future life with God, for example, promised: 'Upon my death I will let fall a shower of roses; I wish to spend my heaven in doing good upon the earth.'

All Souls' Day: Saturday 2 November

On Saturday, All Souls' Day, there will be a Mass at 9.30am. Come and pray for your deceased loved ones and all the Faithful Departed. We are united with them all in the 'Communion of Saints', as we profess in the Creed at Mass. Far from being the ridiculous spooky 'ghosts and ghouls' touted in secular 'Halloween', we are remembering our dear departed brothers and sisters whom we love. We still pray for them after they have died, confidently entrusting them to the loving mercy of God, and asking that they will enjoy the fulness

of life with God for which they hoped and prepared since their baptism, and that, in God's presence, they will also pray for us.

'<u>Holy Souls envelopes' will be available at the back of Church</u> from this weekend. You can use them to:

- Enclose money offerings or cheques as Mass Stipends for 'Holy Souls' Masses: these will be celebrated in this month of November and throughout the coming year (offerings should be *gift-aided*, by signing the back of the envelope). Every £10 donated ensures one Holy Souls' Mass will be offered for *all the Faithful Departed* (including your particular loved ones). You can also make such offerings using the special option on our Card Reader.
- If you wish, you may also enclose the names of deceased relatives, parents or friends *collectively*, they will be included whenever a 'Holy Souls' Mass' is offered here.
- Many parishioners also write their names in our 'Book of Remembrance' which, from All Saints' Day throughout November, will be on the table in front of the Altar. Pray for all whose names are written there and, if you wish, add names of deceased relatives or friends on the sheets which will then be put into its pages. All will be prayed for at Mass during this month.

Intentions for our Prayer

Pray for Peace. The horrific onslaught on the people of Gaza and the West Bank has now been extended to Lebanon (and might well be extended elsewhere). The wars in Ukraine and other places are deadlocked, but the innocent still suffer. Pray fervently for a lasting peace with justice for all, for an end to the starvation, killing, wounding, and trauma of innocents, and the unnecessary destruction of people's homes and livelihoods.

Pray for Peace in so many other troubled places across our world including: Afghanistan, Armenia and Azerbaijan, Cameroun, Chad, China, Colombia, Ethiopia, Haiti, Hong Kong, Mali, Myanmar, Nigeria, Russia, Sudan, Syria, Thailand, Yemen.... and all the other places where the innocent are caught up in the violent power struggles of others. And for the many Christians who face persecution this day in so many parts of the world.

The SYNOD in Rome celebrates its Mass of closure with Pope Francis in Saint Peter's Basilica this

Sunday. During this month, the delegates from across the world have met to listen and discuss how our Church can better live and travel together. In the last days they have been finalising their recommendations to Pope Francis. Pray that, through the guidance of God the Holy Spirit, the discussions, listening and debate of the last three years may bear fruit for the worldwide Church of the twenty-first century.

Join with the Pope's Prayer Intention for November 'for those who have lost a child': We pray that all parents who mourn the loss of a son or daughter find support in their community and receive peace and consolation from the Holy Spirit.
