

Holiness comes through loving God, with all our heart, mind, soul and strength, as we hear again in



Sunday's Gospel. 'Journeying to Holiness' has been the idea underlying most of the events we have organised over the last year. We have just begun this month giving God thanks for all the Saints. Holiness is our vocation.

So, in the coming months, we will continue with **talks on Holiness**, drawing on the inspiration of some more important saints. In Lent, we reflected on Saint Paul, Saint Thérèse of Lisieux, and John Bradburne. In September, we focussed special celebrations on our patron, Saint Vincent de Paul. Next, we are offering the opportunity to learn more **about Saints connected to the local religious communities in our neighbouring parishes.**

1. On <u>Thursday 14 November</u> in the Hall, Fr John Dickson, the Rector of the local Salesian Community in Sacred Heart Parish (Brother Paulin's Superior), will share with us about Saint John Bosco, their Nineteenth Century founder: his talk is called **'Education is a matter of the Heart' – Saint John Bosco and the Salesian Spirit**. This will take place in the Hall: refreshments from 7pm, talk at 7.30pm. He will explore what Salesian Spirituality means and its history, and how St John Bosco adapted this to educating young people in the Turin slums of his day.

In Lent, there will be a talk about **Saint Alphonsus Liguori**, who founded the Congregation of the Most Holy Redeemer, who have served Saint Mary's Parish in Clapham since the Nineteenth Century.

2. On <u>Friday 6 December at 7pm</u>, we are holding the next of our Services of Adoration Prayer and Reconciliation. As our parish community starts its Advent journey, we invite you to join us with your family and children for an Advent evening of Reconciliation and Mercy: come and adore Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament, receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation and enjoy a moment of peace, prayer and music. 'These Services are for all, and especially First Holy Communion and Confirmation families. Come back to me with all your heart'.

Confessions will be available in English, French, Italian. Provision will be made to care for your younger children if you would like to receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation.

If you came to the services earlier in the year, come again this time. If you enjoyed the experience, invite others to come with you. If you couldn't come last time, come along this time.

The New Lectionary will come into use in four weeks' time

The Lectionary is the name for the collections of Scripture readings and psalms used in the Liturgy, principally at Mass, and for the other Sacraments. Work has been going on to produce a fresh translation which, it is claimed, will be more faithful to the original languages, use better and more up-to-date biblical scholarship, and be "more proclaimable". So we will certainly notice the difference, as we have used the current 'Jerusalem Bible' for most of our lifetimes.

A new Lectionary means we have purchased new Liturgical Books: four volumes, plus a Processional Gospel Book. Those familiar with our present lectionary volumes will know that most have reached the point where they would have needed replacement anyway, as the covers have come away and the pages are dogeared.

We have received the new books, and will display them shortly. Some parishioners might like to 'sponsor an individual volume', perhaps in memory of somebody – a dedication plate can be put inside the front of a volume. If anyone wishes to do so, or to know more, have a word with me and I can give you an idea of the cost.

The Eternal Life for which we hope: 'we shall be like him because we shall see him as he really is'

During November, Catholics particularly pray for our loved ones who have died (the 'Holy Souls'). We pray about the future we hope to enjoy after death – the fulness of that divine life we have already started to share with God here and now. So, we honour the Saints and pray for the Holy Souls:

'Holy Souls envelopes' are available at the back of Church. You can use them to:

- Enclose money offerings or cheques as Mass Stipends for 'Holy Souls' Masses: these will be celebrated in this month of November and throughout the coming year (offerings should be *gift-aided*, by signing the back of the envelope). Every £10 donated ensures one Holy Souls' Mass will be offered for *all the Faithful Departed* (including your particular loved ones). You can also make such offerings using the special option on our Card Reader.
- If you wish, you may also enclose the names of deceased relatives, parents or friends *collectively*, they will be included whenever a 'Holy Souls' Mass' is offered here.

Many parishioners also write names in our **'Book of Remembrance'**, which throughout November is on the table before the Altar. Do pray for those whose names are there and, if you wish, add names of your deceased relatives or friends on the sheets which are then put into it. All will be prayed for at Mass during this month.

Pray for Peace. The horrific onslaught on the people of Gaza and the West Bank has now been extended to Lebanon (and might well extend elsewhere). The wars in Ukraine and other places are deadlocked, but the innocent still suffer. Pray fervently for a lasting peace with justice for all, for an end to the starvation, killing, wounding, and trauma of innocents, and the unnecessary destruction of people's homes and livelihoods.

Pray for Peace in so many other troubled places across our world including: Afghanistan, Armenia and Azerbaijan, Cameroun, Chad, China, Colombia, Ethiopia, Haiti, Hong Kong, Mali, Myanmar, Nigeria, Russia, Sudan, Syria, Thailand, Yemen.... and all the other places where the innocent are caught up in the violent power struggles of others. And for the many Christians who face persecution this day in so many parts of the world.
