The Presentation of The Lord

This Sunday, the Christmas season concludes with the **Feast of the Presentation of The Lord in the Temple** (Candlemas), commemorating a customary Jewish event which happened 40 days after Jesus' birth. Mary his mother, and Joseph are ready to *offer back* to God the Father the one whom they have received as God's greatest gift, Jesus. Our Archbishop, John Wilson, wrote a while ago: 'In bringing the Lord Jesus to the Temple, Mary and Joseph thankfully offer God's gift back to God. This gesture is the pattern of salvation and the way of all Christian living. The very life that the Lord Jesus received, the very life for which His parents gave thanks, is the life He offered, He presented, back to the Father. But this time through a costly sacrifice, a personal sacrifice, in the temple that was His body, on a cross that pained His mother's soul.'

In the Gospel on Sunday, the Presentation is described. How Mary and Joseph entering the Temple of God to make the offering (a poor person's offering) that 'redeems' their first-born son, are met by the elderly Simeon, a man of hope. The words he utters when the Holy Spirit inspires him to go to the Temple are prophetic both for the Holy Family and for the world. For Mary, he predicts that 'a sword will pierce through your own soul too': she will share uniquely in Jesus' future suffering and rejection thirty-three years later. For the world, for us, because his words recognise in this child Jesus the Salvation God has prepared not only for the Jews but



for all people, including you and me. 'My eyes have seen your salvation that you have prepared in the presence of all peoples, a light for revelation to the Gentiles, and for the glory of your people Israel'. His words are known, after the Latin for their opening, as the Nunc dimittus ('Now Lord you are letting your servant depart'). They have often been set to music beautifully, and form the Canticle in the Church's Night Prayer (Compline), and one of the Canticles at Anglican Evensong. Because Simeon hails Jesus as 'a light', it has been traditionally an occasion to bless the Church's candles (hence 'Candlemas')

This Feast is also *The World Day for Consecrated Life*, an occasion to pray and give thanks for all the Religious Men and Women who serve in the schools, parishes and institutions across the world, many of whom have touched our own lives. We might include a prayer for our near-neighbours, the Salesian Priests, Aspirants, and Sisters in Battersea West Sacred Heart parish, especially Brother Paulin; and the Jesuits, whose community on the Common has also played a part in the life of our parish.

These are not intended to be formal gatherings organised by the parish, but you are encouraged to do so in whatever way seems best to you. If anyone does wishes to hold small group meetings in the Hall, that should be possible.

Significant Events in our Parish in the first part of the Jubilee Year

We form part of the Body of *Christ in South Battersea*, part of the Church of Southwark diocese. As the diocesan *Called to Bear Fruit* process takes place, we also work in hope for renewal in our own lives and as the Parish community here. The Jubilee Year of Hope is calling us to this. Pick up a FREE Orange Jubilee Guide, if you did not yet do so.

In Lent, <u>during March</u>, we shall be reflecting on three Sundays about our Parish life here and on how each of you can build up the Body of Christ among us, by offering your time and talents, and your financial support too, to help deepen our Parish life.

We begin our Lenten journey of repentance and renewal on Ash Wednesday (5 March)

 On Friday 6th March at 7pm: we will hold another Service of Adoration and Reconciliation. As in Advent, there will be other visiting priests available for Confessions. This event is for the whole Parish. It is especially in the Calendar of sessions for the families preparing their children and young people for their First Holy Communion, and for Confirmation.

- Just before Lent, on Thursday 20 February from 7pm, a priest from our neighbours, the Redemptorist Community at St Mary's, Clapham Common, will speak to us about their founder Saint Alphonsus and what we can learn from this wonderful saint. This is part of our ongoing Series about Holiness which we began last year.
- That will be followed, during Lent, by a Talk about Padre Pio, The Curé of Ars, and Confession (date tbc).
- On Saturday 15 March some of our young people will be attending the Flame Gathering for Young Catholics from across the country. This major event is held at Wembley. Pray that it will touch the hearts of those who go.

Pray for the success of our Confirmation Retreat

Next Saturday 8 February we are holding a **Day Retreat for our Confirmation Candidates.** As they reflect on the Sacrament and their calling, **pray for them**, that they will respond to the graces of the Holy Spirit with a deeper commitment to Christ.

After Easter:

- o Canon Gerard Bradley will be here to Celebrate Confirmation at 11am Mass on Sunday 27 April.
- We are organising a **Jubilee Walking Pilgrimage** in our local area, with people from neighbouring parishes, hopefully on Saturday 10 May.
- o First Holy Communions will be celebrated on Sunday 11 May.
- On Saturday 7 June, our diocese is gathering for a Jubilee Day at The Friars, Aylesford. Note the date now we have organised a parish Coach.
- o Brother Paulin will likely be ordained a Deacon at Sacred Heart parish on 15 June.
