- You can now use our Card Readers to pay for Candles, and for Booklets and Newspapers.
- Our Church is normally open each day from early morning until dusk for private prayer, Stations of the Cross etc. Should I be away, or returning late, it may exceptionally be sometimes closed.

Lent and Lenten Devotions

<u>Holy Week and Easter</u> are the climax of the Christian year. In the Services, the Liturgy of the Word is particularly important and rich. If you are one of our regular Readers, or might like to volunteer to assist, please sign up on the sheets at the back of Church. You are asked to sign your name next to EVERY Service you will be attending, and you will be allocated where the need is greatest, and be notified.

<u>Next Friday</u> from 7.15pm until 8pm: A Lenten time of Silent Prayer and Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament. Do come along to pray for the many needs of the world at this time.

On <u>Saturday 5 April at 4pm</u> for all in the Parish: Stations of the Cross will take place followed by a short period of Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament, finishing at around 5pm.

Please take advantage of this opportunity to meditate on the Passion of our Lord as we approach the end of Lent. As in previous years we will be asking different people to read one of the Stations as we process around the church.

Our Pilgrimage from Easter to Pentecost with our Parish and Diocese

Easter to Pentecost in this Holy Year will be a time of Prayer and Renewal across the whole Diocese and Keep Saturday 7 June Free in Your Diary for the Exciting Event below!

Pilgrimage to Pentecost - As part of the Jubilee Year in our Southwark Diocese, there will be a big outdoor Celebration for the whole diocese, a **Jubilee Day at The Friars, Aylesford on Saturday 7 June** from **10.30 am -4.30 pm** in the grounds of the historic Priory. **A coach has been booked by our Parish but you will need to book early** - cost £30 for adults and £10 for children/under 18s. Some will also be joining a walking pilgrimage, for those want to walk the 50 miles from St George's Cathedral to Aylesford, from 2 – 5 June. Pilgrims will be staying in parish church halls along the way and arriving at Aylesford on Friday 6 June.

The 7th June will be a day of fun and faith for all the family. It will include talks, Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament, the Rosary, Confessions, Prayer for Healing, exhibitions and fun activities for children, as well as the joy of just being outside relaxing in this beautiful historic place. There will be performances from local singers and musicians and other special surprises! People are encouraged to bring your own picnics, but food, including a barbecue, a tea room and ice creams will be available on site (though probably with queues). The day will culminate in a **concelebrated Mass led by Archbishop John**, who will pray a special blessing on all those present and on the whole diocese.

In preparation for the day, our Parish will be running **Pilgrimage to Pentecost**, a six-session course to deepen our understanding of the work of the Holy Spirit in our lives. The sessions will comprise pre-recorded talks, a faith testimony and music accessible via YouTube, as well as an opportunity to share with others online or in person.

An accompanying booklet will be available soon, with meditations for every day between Divine Mercy Sunday until the week after Pentecost. You can follow this course on your own at home, join a group in the Parish, or join an Online Group. Currently, two groups at St Vincent's have been proposed, but if you would like to host another please see Father Tim. One group will be meeting on Wednesday evenings (contact Stuart Edwards <u>ste7474@icloud.com</u>) and another on Wednesday mornings 9.30 am - 11 am (contact Kristina Cooper, as above). - First Holy Communions will be celebrated at 11am Mass on Sunday 11 May.

Intentions for our Prayer

destruction to the Palestinian people of the occupied West Bank. Rwandan sponsored 'rebel' troops are killing thousands in the DRC in a bid to acquire precious minerals. The innocent go on suffering. Pray fervently for lasting peace with justice for all, for an end to the starvation, killing, wounding, and trauma of innocents, and the utterly unnecessary destruction of people's homes and livelihoods.

Pray for Peace in the many other troubled places across our world including: Afghanistan, Armenia and Azerbaijan, Cameroun, Chad, China, Colombia, Democratic Republic of Congo, Ethiopia, Haiti, Hong Kong, Mali, Myanmar, Nigeria, Russia, Sudan, Thailand, Yemen.... and all the other places where the innocent are caught up in the violent power struggles of others.

And for the many Christians who in so many parts of the world continue to face persecution for their faith in Jesus Christ, the incarnate Son of God.

Pray for the recovery to health of Pope Francis, still in hospital. Join with his **Prayer Intention** for **March – for families in crisis:** 'Let us pray that broken families might discover the cure for their wounds through forgiveness, rediscovering each other's gifts, even in their differences.'

Pray for Survivors of Sexual Abuse especially those who have suffered through the actions of people in the Church.

For our youngsters preparing for Confirmation at the end of April, and the children preparing for First Holy Communion in May; and that in the future their families will continue to support their faith.
